

Research Integrity – Arts and Humanities (2EC):

This mandatory course consists of 7 weekly morning sessions (online), starting Tuesday October 6th (9:00-10:30h). **Registration is possible until September 11th**. Every week, we will deliberate over one theme related to research integrity, ranging from breaches of research integrity to responsible supervision. Those conducting empirical research will design a data management plan as part of the course. You will follow workshops on replication in the humanities and researcher assessment. Participants are expected to read materials prior to attending the sessions, so the online time can be used for interactive debate. Please be aware that attendance during the sessions is compulsory to obtain the certificate needed to complete your education program as a PhD in the humanities. Key issues in the Humanities (2EC):

In previous years this course has been combined with a Graduate Seminar for Master's and Research Master's students in the Faculty of Humanities. Due to the corona measures it is not clear yet whether we can organize a Graduate Seminar and if so, in which way. But we will organize the Key Issues in the Humanities course to identify and discuss the actual main topics in the Humanities and the issues you come across in your own research. For now it is not certain if we are allowed to organize the workshops at campus. If not the sessions will be online.

The dates will be: Wednesday 2 December (15.30-17.00hrs), Wednesday 16 December (15.30-17.00hrs) and Wednesday 6 January (15.30-17.00hrs). If we could organize a Graduate Seminar, with presentations about Key Issues and active participation in the discussions by the PhD candidates of the Key Issues course, this Graduate Seminar will take place and Wednesday 27 January (afternoon).
